VIEW THE SUNDAY SERVICE TAPING

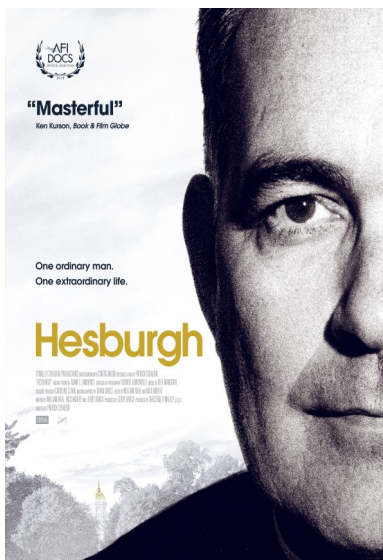
Cont.- Two persons are invited each Saturday to view the taping of the service. Participants would need to arrive by 10:00 a.m. Masks are required.
