

71st Annual Conference of the International Council of Community Churches

GOOD NEWS! If you're still thinking about going to the ICCC's annual conference, you can still take advantage of the early bird registration discount. Register before June 25th, and the price is \$195, a \$35 discount!

Unfortunately, low registration numbers, and significant limitations dictated by the COVID response, has prompted ICCC leaders to cancel the children's, youth and young adult programs for the 2021 Annual Conference. While things are getting back to normal, required distancing and space limitations prompted the cancellation of the Rise Against Hunger event. Organizers hope they will be able to replace the Hunger Mission with another opportunity that fits our restrictions and attendance. If that opportunity presents itself, we will let you know a.s.a.p.

Here's a look at some of the things you can expect at this year's conference:



Chaplaincy – The Clinical and the Practical —*Chaplain Rev. John Sugden*, will provide a framework to better understand the emotional content of patient conversations, the dynamics of grief and loss and how we honor the patients truth and give it reverence. Motivational interviewing and the healing power of listening and bearing witness will be covered in depth.

Chaplain Wendy Childress' Family Wellness Workshop is for parents, grandparents, guardians, and children (8 and older). Learn techniques to help you navigate this ever-changing relationships. Get the tools you need to help you go through the hard times as well as the good times.
