PENTECOST OFFERING

Rev. Allen Shelton, a veteran educator, community advocate and pastor, was determined to stop watching teens in his community feed the school-to-prison pipeline. So, in 2010 he founded Good Success Academies, a nonprofit organization in Newark, NJ.. "At-risk youth of color attending urban public schools had no chance of success in getting good, high-paying positions."

Initially, Shelton modeled the program after a tutoring program he worked with while in Chicago. Members, who are educators, helped him start the program.

"In addition to a Bible study for confirmed students, we had an academic college writing class where a



teacher worked with the kids and moved them to writing at a college level. We also provided an opportunity for them to explore careers by working with members of our congregation."

Helping youth to achieve their Godgiven potential is what the Pentecost Offering — one of the PC(USA)'s four Special Offerings — is all about.
